

## Honor and Courage


What does it mean to have honor and courage?—*To Kill a Mockingbird*, short stories, articles

## EXTRA HELP:

Tutoring for English will be available on **Wednesdays** from **3:30-4:30** every week – and Mrs. Rogers is in charge of it.

## **CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:**

- Beginning of Class: Students should be in their seats by the time the tardy bell rings. There will always be a <u>DO NOW</u> prompt on the board, and its title says that you start working right away.
- Bathroom: You will have <u>TWO (2)</u> bathroom passes for the entire semester. Use them wisely. If you go past your allotted number, you will owe me 10 minutes after school.
- Grades: Do NOT ask me for your grade during class. I post grades regularly on PowerSchool, so check your grades there.
- Make-up Work: If you are absent, it is your responsibility to make up any work you've missed. Ask classmates and ask me BEFORE or AFTER school – NOT during class time. As per CHS policy, you have five (5) days after you return to make up any homework, quizzes, tests, etc.
- Late Work: I DO take late work as circumstances require. Any major assignments that are late will be deducted 10pts a day unless otherwise notified.
- End of Class: I dismiss the class; the bell does not. Everyone will be seated and the room will be orderly before I dismiss class.



## CHESNEE HIGH SCHOOL RE-DO POLICY:

In an effort to increase student achievement, students will be given the opportunity to redo a major test grade if he or she fails to pass the assessment:

#### Guidelines:

The highest grade a student can earn on the retest is a 70.

- 1. Only major tests are eligible for a redo.
- 2. Students will have five (5) school days from receiving the original grade to redo the assessment.
- 3. Students must get extra help before earning extra points.
- 4. Students must redo all of the questions missed on the first test; however, no credit will be given for true/false or questions that only have two possible answers.
- 5. Students will receive half credit for each question answered correctly on the redo up to a grade of 70.
- 6. Students must make arrangements to retake the test and get extra help before or after school.
