- Quizzes will carry a weight of x2 in the minor grade category


The list of what qualifies for which grade may be modified as I deem necessary, but you will be notified



STEAM Academy:

You'll work with students on this wing to investigate and attempt to solve the problem of hunger on a local and national scale. There will be multiple times when we'll work with other classes to share our information and products in order to benefit our community. CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:

- Beginning of Class: Students should be in their seats by the time the tardy bell rings.

- End of Class: I dismiss the class; the bell does not. Everyone will be seated and the room will be orderly before I dismiss class.



CHESNEE HIGH SCHOOL RE-DO POLICY:

In an effort to increase student achievement, students will be given the opportunity to redo a major test grade if he or she fails to pass the assessment:

Guidelines:

The highest grade a student can earn on the retest is a 70.

- 1. Only major tests are eligible for a redo.
- 2. Students will have five (5) school days from receiving the original grade to redo the assessment.
- 3. Students must get extra help before earning extra points.
- 4. Students must redo all of the questions missed on the first test; however, no credit will be given for true/false or questions that only have two possible answers.
- 5. Students will receive half credit for each question answered correctly on the redo up to a grade of 70.
- 6. Students must make arrangements to retake the test and get extra help before or after school.
